Dr. Delaney holds a Master of Science in Environmental Science and recently completed a doctoral degree studying the phenomenon of polar mesospheric cloud over the Arctic. Also known as Noctilucent clouds, they are beautiful natural phenomena, that appear in the night sky over the Arctic during the summer. It has been speculated that they may be linked to increased amounts of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere and therefore may act as an indicator of global warming trends.
