WHAT DOES IT COST TO EDUCATE A RESPIRATORY THERAPIST STUDENT?

List of Projected Expenses for Students Enrolling and Completing a 2-yr. Associate Degree Program

1. **College tuition/Fees:** (\$26.00 per unit of credit – California resident)
 - a. Pre-requisite courses: English, Algebra, Chemistry, Anatomy, Medical Terminology
(19 units @ \$26.00) = \$494.00
 - b. Respiratory Therapy Classes (48.5 units @ \$26.00) = \$1261.00
 - c. Sciences Courses: Physiology, Microbiology
(9 units @ \$26.00) = \$234.00
 - d. Additional general education to complete A.S. in Respiratory Therapy.
(18 units @ \$26.00) = \$468.00
 - e. Health Services fee = \$82.00
 - f. Student Body fees (ID, student union) = \$32.00
 - g. Campus Parking = \$160.00

Total = \$2731.00

 2. **Textbooks and Required Materials:** These are approximate and change yearly:

Total First Year RT Books	= \$450.00
Total Second Year RT Books	= \$450.00
Lab Supplies/ Materials	= \$ 50.00
Uniform / Stethoscope	= \$100.00

 3. **Transportation costs:** (based on average of 30 mile round trip distance to classes and various hospitals throughout San Francisco and San Mateo Counties @ .20/per mile cost. Average 3 days per week x 71 weeks (5 semesters) x 20 mile round trip – approximately 4,260 miles x .20 / per mile
